CROYDON JUDO CLUB OPENS NEW £1.5 MILLION CENTRE

British Judo was pleased to announce the opening of Croydon Judo Club's new £1.5 million venue, offering some of the best martial arts facilities within the greater London area.

The official opening ceremony took place on 29th January and featured talent from the club with a spectacular presentation of their skills. Also present at the opening ceremony were past and present members from the club's 54 year history. In addition, Densign White, Chairman of British Judo Association, opened the centre with a symbolic speech to which the audience, including Stuart Collins, Councillor for Culture, Media and Sport along with his fellow members of Croydon Council, listened intently.

The new facility, located at The Cedars off Morland Avenue, gives the club a permanent home after moving from various temporary facilities over the last 30 years. The club has had more than four different venues including a school and a converted restaurant. But with the support of the London Borough of Croydon and the Sir Philips Games Trust they now have their own centre, which is a valued addition to the community. London Borough Council and Sir Philips Games Trust contributed £300,000 to the total cost of the £1.5 million centre, which boasts four mat areas on a sprung wooden floor.

Croydon Club Coach, Danny Harper 4th Dan, said: "We are extremely pleased to finally be in a centre that we can call home. With the help of the local council and various individuals that have shared our passion, we are now able to offer contemporary facilities for all those members and visitors that have stuck by the club as we have moved around during the last 30 years."

Scott McCarthy, Chief Executive of the British Judo Association, said: "The new venue offers not only a large practice area but also state of the art video and audio equipment in order to record and play back technical training. These facilities will be important to British athletes training for the 2008 and 2012 Olympics, allowing them to review and improve upon their performance."

"In the lead up to 2012 it is also likely that the centre will be used by international teams looking for contemporary training facilities within the London area".
