BRITISH JUDO BRING HOME TWO MEDALS FROM MOSCOW SUPER A TOURNAMENT

British Judo started the 2004 European A Tournament Season at the Moscow Super A Tournament on 24/25 January. They picked up two bronze medals; a bronze from Winston Gordon in the Men's -90kg and a bronze from Michelle Rogers in the Women's -78kg. Peter Cousins finished 5th after losing to Winston Gordon in an all-British fight for the bronze medal.

Great Britain returned from the World Championships in Osaka Japan with four automatic Olympic qualification places (Women's -52kg, -70kg, +78kg and Men's -60kg), but what happens now?
