British Squad Player Agreement



As a member of the British Judo Association National Squad, the terms and conditions of your inclusion in the British Judo Association World Class Programme (WCP) are detailed in the British Judo Policies and Procedures document. It is important that you read this document carefully before signing this agreement.

There are two copies of this agreement and you are required to sign both copies where indicated (countersigned by parent/guardian if you are under the age of 18). One copy should be retained by you and the other returned to the BJA no later than Friday 22nd January 2010.

- have read, understood and agree to comply with the policies and procedures detailed in the BJA National Squad Policies and Procedures document

- agree to make a commitment to training, competing and working with all BJA staff and my personal coach(s) with the aim of winning medals at the highest level.
- agree to attend **all ranking competitions** unless written explanation is given.
- Agree to attend National Squad training unless written explanation is given with a minimum of 2 weeks' notice.
- agree to comply with all reasonable requests made by the BJA for information and/or documentation in connection with the monitoring of my training and competition schedule, weight management and utilisation of any awards I receive in the pursuit of sporting excellence
- agree to inform the BJA immediately both verbally and in writing of any changes to my personal circumstance that might affect my participation in the BJA National Squad or World Class Programme and/or in the sport of Judo itself (including weight management issues)
- have read, understood and agree to comply with all anti-doping laws/rules and drug test requirements of the BJA, UK Sport and the IJF
- understand that my inclusion within the BJA National Squad is under constant assessment and my continued participation within the Squad is dependent on my commitment to the programme.

I understand that failure to adhere and comply in full to any part of this document or the Policies and Procedures document may result in my immediate removal from the British National squad and all benefits associated with it (including the withdrawal of any personal funding I may receive) and that it may jeopardise my future inclusion within any of the BJA's World Class Programmes.

IT IS STRONGLY RECOMMENDED THAT ALL BRITISH SQUAD PLAYERS TAKE OUT PERSONAL MEDICAL INSURANCE. IF YOU ARE A NON FUNDED PLAYER THIS IS YOUR RESPONSIBILITY, UNLESS INFORMED OTHERWISE

Appendix 1: Important Notices

BJA EXPENSE CLAIM FORMS:

Any claims for travel expense must be preapproved by the World Class Operations Manager. It is expected that you travel by the most economic means possible

All expense claims must be made **within 2 weeks** of completion - THEY WILL NOT BE PAID IF YOU FAIL TO DO SO.

The current mileage rate which players may claim is 15p per mile.

In certain circumstances, i.e: for players who don't drive, or to prevent long stays at airport car parks, players may claim double mileage. For example: parents/friends taking players to the airport for the outbound flight, and then collecting them again on their return.

MISSED FLIGHTS:

Any charges incurred as a result of a British Judo Team player, coach or support personnel missing a flight that has been booked on their behalf by the association, will be the responsibility of the person missing the flight. This includes, but is not exhaustive, fees to change flight, cost of a new flight, cost of overnight accommodation, meals etc. This will also apply in the case of changed flights, without exceptional reason.

MEAL CONTRIBUTION:

Wherever possible the BJA tries to ensure Full Board accommodation is provided for any team member when selected by the British Judo Association to represent Great Britain at National & Internal Events. Where this is not possible, a **contribution** towards meal costs is given.
