

Selection of British Judo Association (BJA) players representing Great Britain at the 2010 European Cadet Championships (ECC) will be made according to the following criteria:

The Home Countries (England, Northern Ireland, Scotland & Wales) will nominate players to participate in a Trials event on Saturday 13th March at Kendal Judo Club. Places are allocated as detailed in the table below and it is the responsibility of each of the Home Countries for the selection process used to select the players that they nominate.

| Home Country | Places per Weight Category | Wild Cards per Gender |
|------------------|----------------------------|-----------------------|
| England | 3 | 4 |
| Northern Ireland | 1 | 4 |
| Scotland | 1 | 4 |
| Wales | 1 | 4 |

The trials will be run on a pool to pool basis.

The Selection Panel

The Selection Panel will consist of the BJA Performance Operations Manager, a representative from each of the home countries and the British Judo Associations Head Coach who will chair the selection meeting. If the Head Coach is unavailable to chair the meeting, the Head Coach will select an alternative chair.

Selections

The player winning the trials will be considered for selection to the ECC by the selection panel. Please note the selection panel reserves the right:

- not to select a player for any individual category, if they feel that the player is not of a suitable standard for this level of event.
- not to select a player who they feel is unsuitable as a team member and ambassador for the BJA.

A full review of the ECC selections will take place 7 weeks before the ECC to ensure those selected have adhered to their respective Home Country programme fully.

Following selection, the selection panel retains the right to deselect a player at any time:

- If they do not fully participate in the event preparation and team activity programme
- If their performance following selection falls below the required standard
- If there are weight management issues (according to BJA weight policy for U18 year olds)*
- If they are medically unfit to compete as a result of injury or illness
- If there is behaviour or other issues
- If they act in any way which is deemed to be detrimental to the BJA

The Selection panel retain the right to require a player to undergo a fitness test and/or a 'fit to compete' test at any time.

*Full consideration should be given Home Countries to enter players in the appropriate weight category for the trials as the ECC will follow 15 weeks later.

It is the responsibility of each of the Home Countries for ensuring that the players they intend nominating for the trials are aware of the selection process.
