Registration: Weigh-In: Venue:	<p>Saturday 10th October from 07:00hrs - 08:00hrs at the English Institute of Sport - Sheffield (located across the road from iceSheffield).</p> <p>All competitors must bring their judo licence to registration. Male players must weigh-in wearing competition acceptable judogi trousers. Female players must weigh-in wearing competition acceptable judogi trousers and a t-shirt. Male players will be given 0.5 kilograms tolerance. Female players will be given 0.6 kilograms tolerance. Players are NOT permitted to change in the designated official weigh-in area.</p>
Qualification and Closing Date for Entries:	<p>Strictly Monday 28th September 2009*</p> <p>Qualification for this event must be achieved via Area/Home Country Trials. Area Trials information will be available on the BJA website by 14th July 2009.</p> <p>On the day of the trials, the BJA Area/Home Country will give successful players the entry form for them to submit. Forms will only be processed if the athletes name corresponds to the result sheets of their Area Trial, the player holds a valid BJA, BJC, AJA or Home Country license, proof of British Citizenship and payment is received. The entry form, prove of eligibility and payment must be received by Monday 28th September 2009.</p>

<p>Mode:</p>	<p>Compound Knockout with Repechage. If a category has 4 players, a pool(s) system may be used.</p> <p>Medals will be awarded as follows: Four players = Gold, Silver and one Bronze only (unless all players win a fight)</p> <p>Five players and above = All four medals to be presented All finals will be at the end of the day</p> <p>Please Note: If a weight category has 3 or fewer players then that category will be withdrawn. The players will be offered the opportunity to compete in the weight category above. If the highest weight category is withdrawn unfortunately the entered players will not be able to compete. The BJA cannot be held responsible for this.</p> <p>If a player rejects the option to fight in the above weight category or the highest category is withdrawn than entry fees will be refunded but the BJA will not be held responsible for event expenses i.e. travel or accommodation.</p> <p>Once the closing date has past the organisers will endeavour to contact all players that maybe affect by a weight category being withdrawn from the event.</p>

<p>Participation: (Minimum grades)</p>	<p>Minimum grade : 10th Mon or 3rd Kyu (green belt) – Shimewaza are permitted and Kansetsu-Waza are not permitted in all weight categories .</p> <p>Contest duration 3 minutes . Golden Score duration 2 minutes .</p> <p>Competitors must hold a current BJA, NIJF, WJA or JudoScotland licence or hold a current licence from the BJC or AJA. All competitors must bring their licence to registration.</p> <p>BJC & AJA competitors must compete in the Area Trials which the club specified in their licence corresponds to, for example, if a players resides in Sheffield but trains at Cedars Judo Club in Leicestershire the player should compete in the Midland's Area Trial event. There are no exceptions to this rule. Please note this will be checked by the Area and BJA.</p> <p>The wearing of blue & white judogi is COMPULSORY for this event. The competitor called for a contest first must wear a blue suit. The competitor called for a contest second must wear a white suit. All competitors must wear a belt of which is appropriate to their grade. The BJA will provide blue judogis for those athletes whose own suit fails judogi control or is damaged. No blue suit = No entry</p>

	Rules and Conditions:	<p>BJA contest rules will be in force throughout the event. All other regulations for this event will be in accordance with the BJA Tournament Handbook, with the following exceptions: -</p> <p>Under BJA Rules if any contestant at this event receives a direct Hansoku-Make (disqualification) penalty he/she will normally be disqualified from that contest only. However if both the referee and judges agree that the action penalised by Hansoku was against '<i>the spirit of judo</i>' then they may recommend that the offending player should not be allowed to continue in the competition. Having made this decision, the Referee and Judges will request that the table officials inform the Competition Controller of their recommendation.</p> <p>In all instances, the final decision to disqualify any player from the remainder of the competition will be made by the Tournament Director in consultation with the Referee and Judges involved and the Referee In Charge.</p> <p>Any competitor who fails to arrive in time for his first contest will lose that contest by FUSEN-GACHI and will be eliminated from the competition.</p>

<p>Hotel Reservations:</p>	<p>Please see the separate information and booking sheet from Sheffield Tourism. Please fill in and return to Sheffield Tourism.</p>
<p>Transport:</p>	<p>Directions to IceSheffield: From M1 (travelling North): Leave motorway at junction 34 (Sheffield Meadowhall). At the roundabout follow signs A6178 City Centre and Attercliffe. Go past Meadowhall Shopping Centre on your right. Keep straight on this road. Go past the Sheffield Arena on your left. Keep straight on this road (Attercliffe Road). IceSheffield is on your left, just before the English Institute of Sport. M1 (travelling south) - Leave motorway at Junction 34. Follow brown signs for Don Valley Stadium / HallamFM Arena (A6109 also signed City). Pass Meadowhall shopping centre on your left, travelling straight on for approximately two miles. At the first roundabout turn left on to Hawke Street / Janson Street (following signs for Don Valley Stadium / Hallam FM Arena). At next roundabout turn right on to Attercliffe Common (A6178), signed IceSheffield. At second set of traffic lights (opposite Natwest bank) turn left onto Coleridge Road. Take next left into car park.</p> <p>From City Centre: Follow signs for M1 / M18 until reaching Park Square Roundabout. From roundabout use lane signed A57. See brown signs for Lower Don Valley (A6109). After exiting roundabout on to A57 "Sheffield Parkway" take left lane at first set of traffic lights signed "Lower Don Valley (A6109)". At second set of lights turn right onto Wicker. At stone arches bare right on to Savile Street A6109. Carry straight on for 2 miles following signs for "Don Valley Stadium / Hallam FM Arena". At first roundabout turn right signed (Hallam FM Arena / Don Valley Stadium) on to A6102 Hawke Street / Janson Street. At next roundabout turn right on to Attercliffe Road A6178. Take second left (opposite Natwest bank) onto Coleridge Road. Take first left into IceSheffield.</p> <p>Supertram: Catch the yellow route tram from Sheffield City Centre or Meadowhall Shopping Centre. Get off the tram at the Don Valley Stadium / Arena tram stop. IceSheffield is just two minutes walk from the tram stop.</p>
