Additional Roles

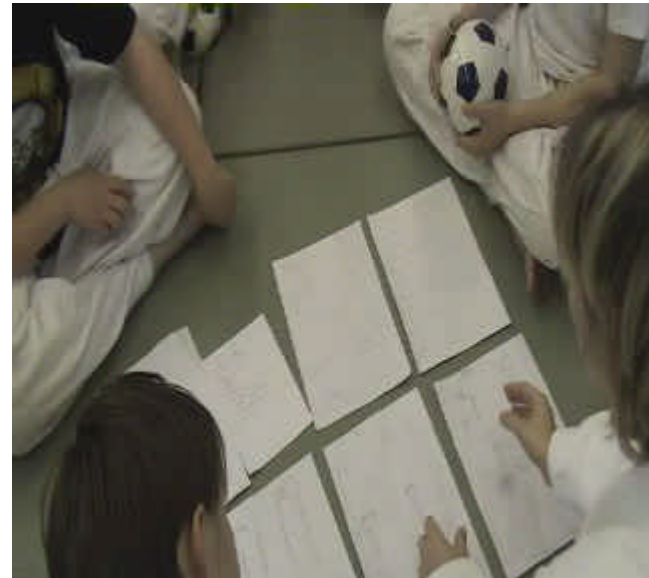
- Junior Development Officer
