All competitors must hold a current BJA licence or licence of an association affiliated to the BJA, IJF, EJU and produce it on the day of the event; all players must be 8 and over on the day of the competition.

Competition will be held on 1 or 2 matted areas depending on entries. Capacity 150 players from for all levels including adaptive players.

WEIGHT CATEGORIES:

Group 1: A band from 8 yrs to born in year 2014 No armlocks and strangles allowed level 2

A1: girls: no weight category- closest weights and grades go together max 5 per group B2: boys: no weight category- closest weights and grades go together max 5 per group

Group 2: Pre cadets born in years 2012 and 2013 No armlocks and strangles allowed level 2

B1: girls: no weight category- closest weights and grades go together max 5 per group B2: boys: no weight category- closest weights and grades go together max 5 per group

Group 3: Cadets born in years 2009 to 2011 (Armlocks and strangles allowed) level 3

C1: females: U40kg, U44kg, U48kg, U52kg, U57kg, U63kg, U70kg, O70kg

C2: : males: U42kg, U46kg, U50kg, U55kg, U60kg, U66kg, U73kg, U81kg, U90kg, O90kg

Group 4: Seniors (Armlocks and strangles allowed) level 3

S1: women: U48kg, U52kg, U57kg, U63kg, U70kg, U78 and plus 78kg S2: men: U60kg, U66kg, U73kg, U81kg, U90kg, U100kg and plus 100kg

Group 5: Masters age 30+ (Armlocks and strangles allowed) level 3

M1: women: U48kg, U52kg, U57kg, U63kg, U70kg, U78 and plus 78kg M2: men: U60kg, U66kg, U73kg, U81kg, U90kg, U100kg and plus 100kg

Masters age groups will be divided into 10 years if numbers allow: 30-39, 40-49, 50-59, 60-69, 70-79

Players over age 60 chokes/ strangles prohibited in accordance with IJF rules.

Categories for level 3 groups will be green belts under and blue belt above.

Divisioning

Divisioning will take place after the weigh in. Prior knowledge and mat assessments, if deemed necessary, will determine the players ability and groups. Communication between Coaches/Carers and Organisers to determine appropriate categories for new judoka in accordance with the **Adaptive Level Help Sheet** attached to these outlines. The Tournament Director will decide the groups based upon historic information and player entry forms. Consideration of pools will be given within divisioning and the discretion of the Tournament Director. Pools found to be unbalanced in play will be adjusted to afford judoka the correct competition for their ability.

Weigh in time:

Weigh in: all judoka age 8-17 have to wear plain white T-shirt and judo trousers. T shirt optional for male 18 and over.

Saturday:

Group 1: 8.45am- 9.15am Adaptive players: 12pm- 12.30pm.

Group 2 and 3: 10.45am- 11.15am Group 4-5: 12.30pm-1pm

Weigh in time may change for group adaptive players and group 4/5, depending on entries received. Club will be informed

Adaptive Level Help Sheet

LEVEL 1 ('Good' level player) This judoka can train and compete with mainstream players. This competitor has a good understanding of the meaning and goal of the competition. All visually impaired players will be divisioned in Level 1 unless they have additional needs. If there are insufficient VI players to make up VI pools they will be allocated to appropriate Level 1 Adaptive pools. (CRITERIA: This judoka is very capable of taking part in competition).

LEVEL 2 ('Medium-good' level player) This judoka can train and take part in randori with mainstream players. This judoka mostly understands the meaning and goal of the competition. (CRITERIA: This judoka is capable of taking part in competition).

LEVEL 3 (Medium' level player) This judoka can take part in training with mainstream players (CRITERIA: This judoka understands the rules, meaning and goal of the competition.)

LEVEL 4 ('Medium-weak' level player) This judoka may only be capable of taking part in special training and competitions. This judoka needs guiding during the competition but generally understands the rules and goal of a competition. (CRITERIA: This judoka needs guiding during the competition but understands the rules and goal of a competition).

LEVEL 5 ('Weak' level player) This judoka may only be capable of taking part in special training and competitions with specialist care. This judoka needs a lot of guidance during the competition. (CRITERIA: This judoka needs a lot of guidance during the competition. The competition may need to be adjusted to suit the judoka's capabilities.)

Judogi & Aids for Adaptive Players

- 1. Only white judogi should be worn.
- 2. Aids are considered outside the standard Judo uniform as described in the IJF Tournament Regulations.
- 3. The Judogi must be adjusted to the physical limitations of the judoka; however, it must not hinder the opponent from performing proper judo technique.
- 4. Wearing white socks with rubber grip dots in Ne-waza is allowed for medical reasons.
- 5. Wearing a plain white round-neck T-shirt under the judogi is mandatory for female athletes. For male athletes, plain white T-shirts may be worn.
- 6. Wearing a mouthguard is allowed if properly fitting and meets regulations.
- 7. Aids must be safe for both the wearer and the opponent and cannot contain hard substances or surfaces, to be decided at the discretion of the main referee.
- 8. The opponent may not be disadvantaged, nor may the wearer have an unreasonable advantage from the aid.
- 9. Glasses cannot have hard surfaces and must fit flush to the face. Sports glasses are allowed once authorised by the tournament director and under the condition that they do not present a risk to either athlete.

Wellbeing

1. Headphones and other devices used to aid calming and wellbeing are permitted off the mat and for medal presentations.
