

# KATA REQUIREMENTS FOR DAN GRADING

## Kata examinations do not need to be carried out at the same time as skills assessments

For 6<sup>th</sup> Dan, in addition to the five kata above, a minimum BJA Level 1 certificate in Koshikino-kata will be required as proof of kata knowledge.

The Kata Commission policy is that kata examinations ideally should not be taken on the same day as participating in a kata coaching course. However, it is recognised that experienced judoka may be able to reach Level 1 standard in one day.

Attendance certificates will not exempt judoka from the kata requirements for promotion to and within the Dan grades.

#### Level 1 – 60% pass mark

- Very much an entry level pass
- Candidates need to show:
  - The correct techniques
  - In the correct order
  - With technical competence
  - Including the 'kata protocol' elements
- Most candidates who have prepared properly for the assessment including attending a relevant BJA Kata Course should pass Level 1

#### Level 2 - 65% pass mark

- Can be taken 6 months after the Level 1 pass
- Candidates should now show enhanced:
  - Skill in technique execution
  - Timing and opportunity exploitation
  - Smoothness and fluidity
  - Coordination between tori and uke
- Fast-tracking directly to Level 2 is only allowed in exceptional cases and requires evaluation by a Senior Kata Examiner or higher

#### **Fees**

There is no BJA fee to take the examination, although the Examiner may charge their own fee to cover expenses etc. There is a BJA fee of £10 required to register the examination pass and to issue a BJA certificate.
