Developing star qualities in Scottish Judoka

Saturday 14th February 2026

The Scottish All Stars Championship focuses on providing a fun experience that appropriately challenges young judoka at this stage in their development. The aim is to maximise the time on the mat whilst introducing more competitive elements of judo. There are many elements to competitive judo that are beneficial to individuals' development, from the application of contest rules and the consequence of breaking them to the feeling and coping with 'pressure'. Most importantly The Scottish All Stars Championship aims to provide positive experiences!

We understand that taking the next step outside the club environment can sometimes be daunting for both parent and child and we hope that the information provided in this document will help to eliminate some of these pressures.



This event is aimed at Judoka that have experience at events in the sampling stage and are looking to progress. This event is perhaps the next step from a club 'rumble' or an inter club event, with a slight increase in the challenge offered but still with plenty of support. If you are unsure, it is suitable for you, please speak to your coach.

Closing date: All entries and payment must be received by 1200 hours on Sunday 1st February 2026. The closing date is in place to allow the event organisers time to organise the day based on entries, the earlier this can be done the more time there is to communicate the timings for the day with participants.

Event Type

A Developmental Event:

The focus of this event is to provide a fun experience that appropriately challenges the young judoka. The aim is to maximise the time on the mat whilst introducing the competitive elements of judo e.g., the 'consequence' of being thrown for Ippon. To this end it is important that participants are of the appropriate 'level' in terms of their development and experience.

Competition

Competitors must arrive at their designated weigh-in times.

After the closing date, but prior to the event we will issue timings for the competitor's weigh – in.

The day will however be split into a morning or afternoon session to limit waiting times, meaning that a competitor will only need to be at the event for one session.

Please monitor your emails prior to the event to see what session you will be competing in.

Rules & Method & Eligibility

A matrix system adaptation will be in place, this will consist of age, and weight, allowing Judoka to split into pools with appropriate competition.

BJA Technical Restrictions will apply along with modified JudoScotland rules.

AA Band Born in the following years, 2018/2017/2016. (Must be 8 years or older on day of event)

- Contest time 2 minutes, no Golden Score
- Maximum Grade 9th Mon and below

A Band Born in the following years, 2015/2014

- Contest time 3 minutes, no Golden Score.
- Maximum Grade 12th Mon and below

B Band Born in the following years Born in the following years 2013/2012

- Contest time 3 minutes, no Golden Score
- Maximum Grade 12th Mon and below

All competitors must hold and produce proof of current membership to JudoScotland.

It is the Judoka's responsibility to check that their licence is in date and that they meet the eligibility criteria to compete.

Any Gold or Silver medallist from any of the 2025 Grand Prix or 2025 Scottish National Closed Championship events, are not eligible to enter, except for any competitors who had two or less in their category.

This is a developmental event; please can coaches make sure that your club players only enter if they are at the appropriate level.

Parents, please check, with your club coach to see if this event is suitable for your child.

No competitor will fight the same opponent more than once, Therefore, where they appear matched again in subsequent round 2, the initial results will be carried forward, this does not apply to the knockout round.

A player must have taken part in the event to be eligible for a medal.

In the case of a 3-way tie, the results will be award to the fastest time.

Long hair must be tied up, above the neckline.

Eligibility

Registration & Weigh-in

Registration & weigh-in will take place on Saturday 14th February 2026.

At registration players must show their valid Judo licence.

Players MUST weigh-in wearing competition acceptable judogi trousers (and t-shirt for both female and male players) Players are ONLY permitted to change in the designated official changing rooms.
