<b>Participation:</b>	<p>Boys and Girls who are a minimum of 8 years old up to and including 15 years old on the day.</p> <p>Competitors must be members of the British Judo Association, or British Judo Council or Amateur Judo Association.</p> <p>Competitors must be Novice to 6<sup>th</sup> Mon (Yellow belt) maximum.</p> <p>Competitors who are entering a category which is different to their sex assigned at birth are requested to contact <a href="mailto:safeguarding@britishjudo.org.uk">safeguarding@britishjudo.org.uk</a></p>
<b>Mode:</b>	<p>Players will be check-weighed-in on the day (at the venue) and will be placed into pools of three, four or five with children as close as possible to their own age/weight/grade and experience.</p> <p>The organisers will, where possible, separate players from the same school and club.</p> <p>All players will receive a medal.</p> <p>Medals will be presented after the group finishes fighting.</p> <p>This is a Level 2 Development Event.</p> <p>Contest duration will be <b>THREE</b> minutes.</p> <p>Please note that these contests may be refereed by one referee only. Junior Referees may be deployed.</p> <p>Shime-waza and Kansetsu-waza will <b>NOT</b> be allowed.</p> <p>The winner will be determined by Scores, and then Penalties.</p>

	<p>If the players are level on Scores and Penalties at the end of the contest the players will immediately start a 3-minute Golden Score contest.</p> <p>The first score or penalty awarded will decide the winner.</p> <p>If the players are level on Scores and Penalties at the end of the Golden Score contest, the Referee(s) will decide the winner on superiority.</p> <p>BJA Technical Restrictions will apply.</p> <p>Throwing Techniques such as the following will <b>NOT</b> score and may be penalised: -</p> <p>Tomoe-Nage, Sumi-Gaeshi, Drop Seoi-Nage, Kube-Nage.</p> <p>A referee may call Ippon if the player is in a hold down and they are satisfied it is best to do so for safety or medical reasons.</p> <p>Coaches are encouraged to help prepare their players to be ready to compete promptly; for example, by helping with belts etc.</p>
