

School 2dojo Link Agreement








Welcome to Clubmark - the British Judo Association's Club Recognition Scheme.

The BJA encourage schools to work with Clubmark accredited clubs who demonstrate their commitment to providing high quality and effective Judo opportunities for young people. This document supports a school and club to agree a partnership that will promote and deliver Judo to young people within a school and raise awareness of community opportunities for sustained participation.



In creating a link both school and accredited club will receive a School 2Dojo certificate in recognition of their partnership.

Things to consider when creating your agreement:

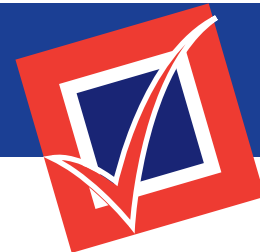
Arrange a meeting between the club and school where you will discuss and agree the School 2Dojo criteria levels and decide what is achievable over a 3 year period.

-  Can delivery be targeted at specific groups of young people within your school?
-  How best can grading and competition be used to motivate pupils and provide positive experience?
-  Agree when you will be in touch to ensure ongoing contact (such as once a week, month, or per term via face-to-face meeting or more regularly via telephone)
-  A risk assessment is carried out on the designated delivery area
-  Sign the agreement and send to the BJA or as part of your Clubmark submission
-  How best can the club utilise the School 2 Dojo Resource Pack once the link has been agreed?
-  If promotion and delivery is going to start prior to club achieving Clubmark then the school are advised to carry out necessary checks on the club and coach (Club registration with the BJA, safeguarding procedures, coach qualifications including first aid and safeguarding)

The Agreement:

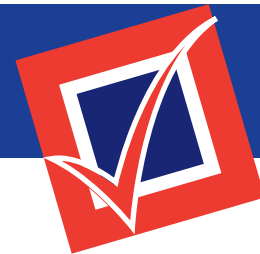
-  School and club will maintain contact and strengthen the relationships between themselves to ensure opportunities are maximised to promote and engage young people in Judo
-  Sessions will be delivered in accordance with British Judo Association guidelines, particularly relating to coaching and officiating, qualifications and safe practices. To ensure the safety of participants, sessions will operate in accordance with both school and club codes of conducts. Both parties as a result will have clear understanding of expected behaviour, required equipment and feedback to sessions. School and club will agree, preferably via email/written confirmation, the details of each session, any payment and staff resources prior to delivery.

School & Club	Have established a Judo Satellite club at the school				Ongoing sessions must be delivered after school hours and formally registered with the BJA as a Satellite club * Please complete Satellite Registration form
School & Club	Ensure students have the opportunity to get involved in either a Young Officiating or Coaching Award each year				Such as TOCS Award. See www.britishjudo.org.uk for further information
School & Club	Ensure students are licenced with the BJA and work towards the BJA Technical Syllabus				Ensure participants are grading at appropriate intervals as recommended by the BJA
School & Club	Ensure that students have the opportunity to enter Level 1 Judo competitions				Local competitions may be organised through schools or participants entered into local club competitions
