

### **Introduction**

The fast track process is for active technical officials who show outstanding ability and knowledge and are considered capable of performing well in the next highest role ahead of their peers. Fast tracking can only be administered and assessed within in the technical official's home area and with the full approval of the home area lead tutor and, as applicable, NCTOC. To maintain standards and the integrity of the fast track process, it is to be used sparingly. NCTOC will maintain a list of fast track candidates beyond CR.

Fast tracking removes the 'time in role' element of the normal pathway process. An age element remains. Fast track candidates must complete CR and SR assessments with a first look, better than minimum, pass mark.

### **To Competition Recorder (CR)**

A candidate of 18 years of age or older and with experience of judo management in a competitive environment and on the express recommendation of the home area lead tutor, can be advanced to CR without first qualifying as a TK.

### **To Senior Recorder (SR)**

A CR of 18 years of age or older with a very active profile, having in addition held THREE licences at Level 2 within one year and run those competitions successfully, can be put forward by their area lead tutor to NCTOC for consideration for fast tracking to SR.

Reminder: A CR must have held THREE Level 1 licences before first applying for a Level 2 licence.

### **To Provisional Competition Controller (PCC)**

After 12 months an active fast tracked SR, having held Licences and successful competitions at Level 3 will be assessed by NCTOC, in consultation with the home area lead assessor, for their suitability to be included on the PCC programme.
