

The Candidate

To properly prepare the candidate for their final assessment the candidate will complete a written assessment and practical assessments, to highlight their areas for improvement and to consolidate their strengths. The programme is not fixed and can be varied after each assessment. The written assessment and first practical assessment will provide the starting baseline of knowledge and skills.

The PCC Candidate Mentor

The mentor is a sounding board and developer, between assessments, of a PCC candidate.

The mentor must be endorsed by NCTOC and will be an active and experienced CC.

The mentor is chosen by the candidate or by NCTOC at the beginning of the candidates PCC programme. The mentor can change at any time.

The mentor will be copied in on all NCTOC to candidate correspondence.

The mentor has no role in the assessment or debrief process. However, if the assessors and therefore NCTOC have concerns that for any reason the candidate cannot complete the course, the mentor will be involved in those deliberations.

The mentor role will continue after the completion of the PCC programme for as long as the candidate needs.
