

The National Refereeing Commission make the selection of referees for applicable events as below:

Events

➤ British Schools Championships	All Referees
➤ Pre-Cadet and Cadet British Championships	All Referees
➤ Junior and Senior British Championships	All Referees
➤ All Visual Impairment Events	All Referees
➤ All Adaptive Events	All Referees
➤ BUCS	8 referees per event
➤ National Teams	8 referees per event
➤ National Masters	8 referees per event
➤ British Minors Championships	8 referees per event
➤ English Open (all types)	8 referees per event
➤ Scottish Open (all types)	8 referees per event
➤ Welsh Open (all types)	8 referees per event
➤ Northern Ireland Open (all types)	8 referees per event

Selection Process

For the events where the NRC select just 8 referees, the organiser shall send their list of the proposed referees (total required minus 8) to the NRC Secretary at least 4 months prior to the event. This list must meet the minimum referee level and volume standards in the handbook for the level of the event.

Assuming the time frame above is met, the NRC will provide a list of the NRC selected referees and reserves in case of none availability to the organiser; it is the event organiser's responsibility to call all referees and request more reserves if insufficient selections are available from the NRC.

Any NRC selections to be amended by the organiser must be approved by the NRC in writing prior to the selection change. The NRC reserves the right to amend any of their selections prior to the event.

Costs and Expenses

All costs and expenses for selected referees are to be borne by the event and are not the responsibility of the NRC or British Judo. The NRC will make reasonable effort to ensure that selected referees are overall cost effective, i.e. the group selected not to be significantly out of order with the general selections made.

Home nations international events

The NRC select referees for home nation international events in a manner instructed to do so by the governing international federation, this would typically be but not limited to the European Judo Union, International Judo Federation or the Commonwealth Judo Association
