### Remember the four 'R's to safeguarding

- Recognise (go with your gut feelings, if it doesn't feel right- talk to your CWO or the BJA safeguarding Team. <u>Child Protection - British Judo</u> and <u>Introduction to</u> <u>Safeguarding - British Judo</u>
- **Respond** to the needs of the person at risk or something they have told you talk to your CWO or the BJA safeguarding Team. Child Protection British Judo and Introduction to Safeguarding British Judo
- Report- if someone is in immediate danger or risk, call emergency services on 999. Report all concerns to your CWO or the BJA safeguarding Team. <u>Child</u> <u>Protection - British Judo</u> and <u>Introduction to Safeguarding - British Judo</u>. From February 2024, this can be done via MyVoice
- Record- pass to the safeguarding team and we will save in our case management system.
