Home Nation Updates

- Northern Ireland Judo Federation: RB updated that it had been busy time with interviews for independent directors and staff. There have been some issues getting Ireland Judo Association (IJA) included in these. However, have now appointed 2 independent directors and a Lead Performance Coach, Sarah Barratt. They Have also appointed a Chair to the Performance Advisory Group (PAG), who comes from Cricket Ireland and no judo background. Looking to have an IJA representative on the PAG but not managed to agree this as yet.
- **JudoScotland:** MP updated that membership is static so won't meet this year's targets, but working on retention and proactively chasing lapsed members. In regard to High Performance, there is an issue with an employee but awaiting an update from Sport Scotland. However, most likely we will move High Performance back in house. On membership costs, JS would like to see more parity across the Home Nations. AS advised that this was on the agenda for the Home Nations Meeting the following week. MP continued that Sport Scotland had met with CEOs and Chairs in regard to funding and it was quite pessimistic, currently down 20% on the last 5 years, however Sport Scotland is trying to keep the reduction away from directly impacting sports. Also, looking to align High Performance more with British Judo as well as conducting a feasibility study on facilities. Lastly, JS will be running a hybrid AGM at the end of the year.
- Welsh Judo Association: LS updated that now Lucy Scott has left there is going to be an interim CEO for 6 months (there has been an internal expression of interest) and there have also been a few Board member changes as well as new Finance and Performance Directors. There is going to be a strategy review over the next few months. Membership has been increasing partly generated by the work in schools as well as girls' judo doing well. There is going to be a cut in Sport Wales's finances which may mean there will be further realignment/review of the budget and strategy.

Aw	 In regard to the insurance tender process, we have had 3 firms send in a proposal. ASI as Audit & Risk Committee member agreed to also review the tenders and feedback. On international relations, AS is going speak to the International Judo Federation about athletes transferring. In the European Judo Union, there is currently a split between the President and General Secretary and the rest of the federation. We are also organising a joint project with Judo France in a French School in London. Saturday I November has been set as the date for the AGM and a Technical Conference. AS then outlined the proposal to change how we present awards this year, in that instead of a dinner (which we heavily subsidise), we would take the awards out to the clubs which would engage the community better and give better PR. There would then be a less formal drinks reception at the British Championships in December. AS continued that the attendees are generally the same each year, we also give away a lot of tickets to winners etc. Comments were whether we should try one more year with everyone paying rather than going cold turkey; how this would be perceived as some people might look forward to it; optics wise it is a good year to do it as not increasing staff salaries and have increased membership fees; marketed as taking a pause and trying something different; will give leverage to making the British Championships a higher profile event; and most successful parts of Judo Day in 2024 were the Neil Adams masterclass; and could still be recognition at the British Championships in front of their peers.
