Mandatory Reporting of Child Sexual Abuse - Free Webinars

On 25 February 2025 the Crime and Policing bill was introduced into Parliament. It includes provisions to introduce a new statutory duty for individuals undertaking key roles with responsibility for children and young people in England to report sexual abuse when they are made aware of it.

NSPCC are running a series of free webinars to support those working or volunteering with children to understand the proposed duty and how it will impact them and their organisation.
